Love

Part I ~ God is Love

Our heavenly Father is *Love*, and because of His *Love*,

we are made spirit beings from His Spirit in *Love*.

And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him. 1 John 4:16

God is the Almighty, Most High, Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow; never changing, Creator of the heavens and earth, and all thereof. He is King of kings and Lord of lords. God is love, this is His nature. *Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever thou hadst formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God.* Psalm 90:2 God has always been.

His love is an agape love unconditional without boundaries, manipulations, or stipulations for it has no dimension. There is no measure of depth, width, or height, nor limitations. Such a love greatly surpasses our carnal ability to comprehend as our human instinct places conditions on this emotion.

There is nothing in existence that God did not create and before the heavens and earth, before Adam, and before we were in the womb yet born of flesh, we were with God. According as he hath chosen us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love; having predestinated us unto the adoption of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will. Ephesians 1:4-5 Because we come from God and He is Spirit, we are spirit of His Spirit.

Part II ~ Christ gives Freedom

For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6

Jesus is God manifested as the Son of God. He is the second of the trinity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost. Christ is the Living Word, the Son of God, the Lamb of God, the Good Shepherd, the Counselor, Light of the World, and the Prince of Peace. Jesus is Lord and Savior, Messiah, El Shaddai, King of kings and Lord of lords; Almighty, our mediator to the Father and our Redeemer from sin. *For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus.* 1 Timothy 2:5

Everything God created He spoke into existence, and as He spoke, Jesus was the Living Word fashioning the foundation of all creation. *And to make all men see what is the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, who created all things by Jesus Christ.* Ephesians 3:9 All things were created by Him and for Him. *For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him: And he is before all things, and by him all things consist.* Colossians 1:16-17

When it was necessary for Christ to come down to earth to save man, the Living Word became flesh. *Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth.* John 1:13-14 In accepting the relationship between the Father and the Son, we can see a picture that tells a story that has always been about man from the very beginning. *For through him we both have access by one Spirit unto the Father*. Ephesians 2:18

Sin separated man from God; however, Jesus reconciled man fulfilling the Father's plan that we be reunited with Him. *For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.* 2 Corinthians 5:21 Jesus' main purpose wasn't to take away man's sins which occurs when we repent. Christ's objective was to reestablish man's relationship with the Father. The spiritual connection God had with His children, Adam and Eve, was severed in the Garden of Eden. Christ came to rectify and reconcile man to his heavenly Father. Jesus brings man full circle to the garden before sin.

## Section III



The Holy Spirit

Power

Part III ~ The Holy Spirit gives Power

Now we have not received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God. 1 Corinthians 2:12

The Holy Spirit is the third in the trinity and is sent on the authority of Christ that each bornagain person may have an intimate communion with the Father. He is our tutor, intercessor, and advocate before the Lord. We are virtually helpless to receive anything from the Kingdom without the Holy Spirit, for heavenly gifts and power come through the Spirit of Truth who is God. Jesus teaches: *And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you. John 14:16-17 This is why Jesus told His disciples He must go, but would send a Comforter knowing the need man would have for the Holy Ghost. Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the Spirit in our hearts. 2 Corinthians 1:22 What Jesus spoke to His disciples remains effectual today. As Jesus is our Savior and mediator, the Holy Spirit is our intercessor and advocate within the Kingdom of Heaven. We can understand the trinity of God as Christ, and as the Holy Spirit, for His Kingdom purpose in reuniting man for a relationship with Himself as it once was with Adam.* 

The Holy Spirit knows what is in our heart and mind so when we pray, He submits our prayerful petitions in a proper format that is acceptable and appropriate to the principles of the Kingdom. Otherwise, our requests would appear as perhaps ramblings and garbled messages without a structured meaning. Because God knows our desires before we ask, our prayers should be sincere with an expected resolution. *And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God.* Romans 8:27

To personally receive the Holy Spirit, we must first be reborn into the spirit person we were created, and we already know to do so with a repentance prayer. Christ comes into our life and God sends the Comforter. Think about what must transpire when we ask to be received, spiritually, into the Kingdom. It is an awesome occurrence and so joyous that surely angels must sing because another child has returned to the Father. *Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth.* Luke 15:10



Love + One

#### You

For thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb. I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvelous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well.
