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Principles for Healing

Introduction

Healing the Spirit, Soul, and Body

How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Ghost and with power: who went about doing good, and healing all that were oppressed of the devil; for God was with him. Acts 10:38

There are two components to healing the body of any emotional and/or physical health crisis which exemplifies the correlation between our spirit and our flesh. Just as we see God in the trinity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, knowing He is all three, so must we view ourselves as the trinity of man with a spirit, soul, and body. To have victory in healing, we have to address the trinity as one; thus to heal the flesh, we have to also consider the spirit and soul.

We cannot separate one from the other and expect a full recovery; however, when we accept all three components of man's existence, the spirit, the soul, and the body, then we can align ourselves and receive healing through God's trinity with authority in the Son, and the channel (means) through the Holy Spirit. It becomes imperative to understand the trinity of the Father and man to receive our miracle or healing.

Protocol for Healing

God's principles within His Kingdom are succinctly planned and provided for man. When we following His instructions, we gain victory.

- I - **Clear your mind**
Release false beliefs

- II - **Repent of unbelief and sin**
Listen only to God's voice

- III - **Rebuke curses**
Release all curses placed in your life, known and unknown

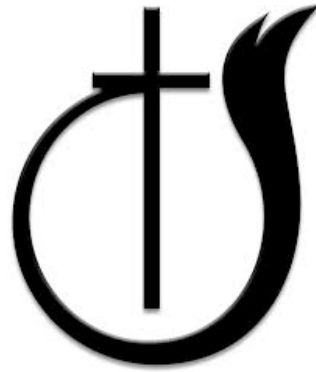
- IV - **Pray for the Father's forgiveness**
Pray for forgiveness of anything that isn't His truth

- V - **Accept your healing**
Believe through the blood of Christ you are healed

- VI - **Understand healing is spirit and natural (flesh)**
Learn that healing is first in the spirit realm, then in the flesh

- VII - **Pray continuously**
Give thanksgiving, praise, and glory to God for your healing

Section I



Kingdom Principles

God's Principles are Simple

Who his own self bare our sins in his own body on the tree, that we, being dead to sins, should live unto righteousness: by whose stripes ye were healed. 1 Peter 2:24

My son, attend to my words; incline thine ear unto my sayings. Let them not depart from thine eyes; keep them in the midst of thine heart. For they are life unto those that find them, and health to all your flesh. Proverbs 4:20-22

Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. Romans 8:26

God wants you well and provided it through His Son, Jesus. We know that everything Christ suffered and died was in God's plan and purpose for our benefit. God provided for our healing, but we are remiss in understanding how to acquire it.

It is important to understand how God created the human body. Our physical body was designed to live forever; however, sin changed this fact. Because it was fashioned for longevity, the systems within our flesh have not changed. The trillions of cells that make the composition of our existence work harmoniously renewing, replenishing, and repairing on an ongoing basis. Sin didn't change how the body functions by design. Each system from Cardiovascular, Digestive, Endocrine, Immune, Integumentary, Lymphatic, Muscular, Nervous, Reproductive, Respiratory, Skeletal, and Urinary all work diligently to keep us in optimum health.

It is our choices that change the dynamics of how our body works. Simply put, bad things in renders bad things out. We truly do reap what we sow, both figuratively and literally, in life circumstances and in health and wellbeing. Cells are constantly duplicating themselves, and replicate into wellness or disease as we see the evidence in ourselves. We are responsible for the welfare of our bodies, and because we live in an unhealthy environment both spiritually and physically, it is even more important to take charge of our life.

God's plan is that we live in good health, but man doesn't accept His plan, and this becomes the reason many believers are not receiving their healing. We have shifted our faith and trust into man's knowledge rather than seeking and trusting in what our heavenly Father instructs, or at the least, we attempt to combine God's Word with man's wisdom. This will void Kingdom power.

Principle #1 - God made you perfect.

God is perfect and He made man from His perfection. Born into a world of sin with a sinful nature, we have to be born-again in spirit to escape the unhealthiness of this fallen world.

So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them. Genesis 1:27

Principle #2 - God made your body to replenish, renew, and repair.

God created the human body with trillions of cells that replicate every nanosecond, continuously, and how they duplicate themselves is what establishes our health and wellbeing. God provided in the earth all the components necessary for maintaining life. We cannot survive without oxygen, water, and food while our general health requires the fruits, vegetables, herbs, etc from the earth. The nutrients from these resources such as protein, minerals, trace minerals, fats, carbohydrates, enzymes, and so forth become the “tools” the body uses for rebuilding and repairing. God has provided all the mechanisms our body requires to replenish, renew, and repair.

Our health is a spiritual journey of belief in all that Christ has given us in freedom from disease and sickness, but also it is important to note that our soul, our thought process, must align in belief for our healing because it will determine the state of our ability to receive.

Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayst prosper and be in good health, even as thy soul prospereth. 3 John 1:2

Principle #3 - God wants you well.

*I will take sickness away from the midst of thee.
...the number of thy days I will fulfill.* Exodus 23:25-26

As a born-again child of the Father, we have Christ and the Holy Spirit living on the inside of us; therefore, we have the supernatural power within us to call upon the authority in Christ and receive through the Holy Spirit our healing (and anything else we desire of God) from the Kingdom of Heaven. It is our Father’s desire and great pleasure to give to His children, to see us whole and healthy, prospering in our earthen life and living for the glory of His Kingdom.

Why are so many believers not healed?

God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power, who went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with Him.

Acts 10:38

And Jesus went all about Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and healing all manner of sickness and all manner of disease among the people. Matthew 4:23

Is God holding out, or are we missing an important element in acquiring healing power from the Kingdom? The answer is many are not receiving a healing or miracle because they lack knowledge and understanding of the principles God set forth within His Kingdom. We have not learned how to receive and apply what our heavenly Father has established for us.

In Christ, we are children of the Almighty King, and joint-heirs to the Father's Kingdom; and yet, we do not live with this understanding of who we are and what we have been given because of God's Son. We hear the scriptures, we read the verses, but we do not accept them in our heart and truly believe them. Why? Because we do not see ourselves as worthy. We have been fed a lie for so long, that we accept the false before we gravitate and hold tightly to the truth, God's Word. Many have been deceived with false doctrines such as everything falls on God because He is a sovereign God, and He is the one who decides who will be healthy, sick, or die. Others put all the responsibility on God with a misguided idea of maybe He will heal, and maybe He won't, it's a matter of waiting to see what God will do. This is plain deception and will prevent healing. We must believe what He has told us in His Word.

Everyone who is a child of the Father should be receiving answered prayers, healing, and experiencing miracles because it is God's desire, and He established it within His Kingdom. If you are not, it isn't because God hasn't put it in His master plan for your life, but rather we are not understanding how to obtain it. He has freely provided, but we must know how to receive healing. The issue lies with us and not with God. However, our misconceptions and lack of the truth keeps us away from what God has provided and given through the blood of Christ.

We must understand how the principles within God's Kingdom work. When we pray, believe, and trust God for our healing, we then exercise patience and hold steadfast for it to manifest from the spiritual realm into the natural. Healing is not an instant realization for the flesh has to undergo a transitional period of restoration. Should it be instantaneous, it would be a miracle by the very hand of God as opposed to working through the Holy Spirit.

Section II



Hindrances & Identification

Hindrances for Healing

*For I will restore health unto thee, and I will heal thee of thy wounds,
saith the Lord. Jeremiah 30:17*

Hindrances can be emotional, physical, or spiritual that causes a state of dis-ease which over the course of time breaks down our bodies innate ability to replenish and repair; thus, the body succumbs to disease. It has been medically proven that guilt causes emotional digression, fear causes stress which becomes the forefront for many diseases, shame causes insecurity, and worshipping idols, statues, or symbols destroys our relationship with our heavenly Father.

There are two perspectives to consider; God's and man's. First, we must understand what God has established, and second, not fall into worldly traps that prohibit our success in attaining our healing. It is human nature to confront more than one of the following, but the key is to not remain in emotional bondage because when we do it changes our thoughts, emotions, and thus, our actions and beliefs. We all will suffer unhappiness, sorrow, disappointment, emotional pain, etc, but we should remember we are renewed in Christ and children of the Almighty King. The list below reflects negativity that is not of God, and He desires we overcome our adversities by turning to Him. If we are held in bondage, it becomes a block to receiving God's power for our healing.

Identification

There are many things that can block the power of God from entering into our life. It only takes one to obstruct the pathway. We should take a serious look at each of the following and determine if any apply as the reason for not receiving a healing.

1) Unforgiving

Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God. 1 John 4:7

Holding grudges blocks love. If we do not forgive those who have done injustices towards us, how then can we expect God to forgive us. God tells us in His Word and is very explicit in His command: *For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you: But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.* Mark 6:14-15 It cannot be explained any more succinct than this. God requires that we have brotherly love for each other and when we face objection, then we forgive the person their wrongdoing and walk away. *Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me.* Matthew 25:40 Pray for forgiveness of anything you are harboring in your heart against another, so that you release any bondage it has entrapped you within.

2) Strife

Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins. Proverbs 10:12

Strife is a complex matter. It encompasses so many things in our life from how we feel about ourselves, to our relationships with our loved ones, to how we interact with others. It can be born of an emotional or spiritual nature and when not recognized, can be very destructive in hearing from God and receiving healing power. *A wrathful man stirreth up strife: but he that is slow to anger appeaseth strife.* Proverbs 15:18 Anger, contention, upheaval, meddling, and so forth bring strife and discontent among family and friends which causes disharmony. *It is an honor for a man to cease from strife: but every fool will be meddling.* Proverbs 20:3

3) Curses

Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not. Romans 12:14

By the very words we speak, we can curse ourselves and others. Negative words whether spoken in humor or seriousness, places bondage on the person spoken to or about. God instructs us to guard our tongue for there is power in our words, just as there is power in God's Word. Curses are real and do affect our life and our health. Man causes many forms of afflictions upon himself, loved ones, friends, and strangers; individually, or as a society. *But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you.* Matthew 5:44 Be armored in God's Word and pray that any curses, known or not, be removed from your life and the lives of your loved ones. *Pleasant words are as an honeycomb, sweet to the soul, and health to the bones.* Proverbs 16:24 It is only a prayer away to receive freedom from a curse.

4) Fear

Therefore being justified by faith we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Romans 5:1-2

If we are in fear then we cannot be in faith, for fear voids faith. Fear is a negative emotion and is not of God. Fear is an emotional response that renders uncertainty and confusion. *For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.* 1 Timothy 1:7 Fear draws us away from God's promises and holds us captive to the emotion which affects our decisions. When fear arises, it should be immediately replaced with faith. We must hold strong and allow our faith to command over fear, and trust in the Father's Word. *For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father.* Romans 8:15

5) *Pride*

For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. 1 John 2:16

Pride is an interesting subject because it's often misconstrued as confidence. What we consider to be confidence in ourselves can in actuality be pride, so how do we define the difference? *The wicked, through the pride of his countenance, will not seek after God: God is not in all his thoughts.* Psalm 10:4 God doesn't accept pridefulness. Typically, a prideful person will seldom change their mind, accept they could be incorrect, and believe they know best. However, a confident individual will ponder and accept evaluation and make the necessary changes accordingly without losing their confidence. *A man's pride shall bring him low; but honor shall uphold the humble in spirit.* Proverbs 29:23 Often, we don't see this element within ourselves, but it's a major stumbling block to receiving from God.

6) *Guilt*

Deliver me from blood guiltiness, O God of my salvation: and my tongue shall sing aloud of thy righteousness. Psalm 51:14

We can all find reason to feel guilty about something we have said or done in our lifetime; however, it is what we do with guilt that determines if we remain in bondage to our thoughts and feelings. When guilty of a word or act, asking forgiveness and letting go is the healthy thing to do. *Accuse not a servant unto his master, lest he curse thee, and though be found guilty.* Proverbs 30:10 Don't hold onto guilt because it will surely strip you from living in righteousness as you are meant to do in Christ.

7) *Shame*

O my god, I trust in thee: let me not be ashamed, let not mine enemies triumph over me. Psalm 25:2

Shame comes from an outside source usually because of something someone has said or done to us that destroys our self-worth, self-esteem, and self-confidence making us feel unworthy. However, there are occasions when we bring shame upon ourselves by our own actions. This is a dangerous mindset because its roots are destructive. *For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed.* Roman 10:11 In Christ, before our heavenly Father, we are cleansed and made righteous by His blood whereby there is no shame. As with sin, shame is washed away by the blood of Jesus. *According to my earnest expectation and my hope, that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but that with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ shall be magnified in my body, whether it be by life, or by my death.* Philippians 1:20 If there is shame within your soul, remember you are free from sin and shame. You are always worthy in the eyes of the Lord.

8) *Grief*

Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted. Isaiah 53:4

Everyone experiences grief, and perhaps the most commonly known is the loss of a loved one; grief due to death is difficult. There is also grief from the termination of a relationship or friendship, or from accidents that leave someone physically challenged. There are many things that can cause grief but it's not a state of mind to remain in. Grief can quickly take our happiness, peace, and joy away leaving us feeling hopeless and helpless. *But if any have caused grief, he hath not grieved me, but in part: that I may not overcharge you all. Sufficient to such a man is this punishment, which was inflicted of many. So that contrariwise ye ought rather to forgive him, and comfort him, lest perhaps such a one should be swallowed up with overmuch sorrow. Wherefore I beseech you that ye would confirm your love toward him.* 2 Corinthians 2:5-8 Don't allow grief to consume you, but break free that your life may be of joy and peace in Christ.

9) *Idolatry*

Wherefore, my dearly beloved, flee from idolatry. 1 Corinthians 10:14

Idolatry is a clever and dangerous element when our attention is focused on persons or things making them important in our lives. It is critical to be very astute in this area and not allow possessions or interests to predominate our thoughts and desires. *Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry.* Colossians 3:5 Fascinations can easily turn into obsessions and take us in a direction whereby we are more mindful of our desires rather than astute to God. *Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, envying, murders, drunkenness, revelings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, and I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.* Galatians 5:19-21

10) *Hopelessness*

For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what man seeth, why doth he yet hope for? But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it. Romans 8:24-25

Our foundation of faith is based on hope. Hope brings the unseen, the things of God, into existence through our continual faith as we pray and stand in hope for what we seek to manifest into our lives. It is hope we cleave to as we hold firm in faith and patiently await the heavenly outcome. *Hope deferred makes the heart sick: but when the desire cometh, it is a tree of life.* Proverbs 13:12 Hope is a critical element in faith, perhaps defined as the substance of having faith. *The hope of the righteous shall be gladness: but the expectation of the wicked shall perish.* Proverbs 10:28 Never give up hope in God's ability to supply for your needs. Hope is just as important as faith because it is a component of faith. *Therefore did my heart rejoice, and my tongue was glad; moreover also my flesh shall rest in hope.* Acts 2:26 Cleave to hope in faith and you shall receive the blessings our heavenly Father has promised.

11) *Thanklessness*

Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name. Colossians 3:15

In all of life, give praise, honor, glory, and thanksgiving to the Lord for His mercy and grace, and His blessings and promises for they are bountiful. *Being enriched in every thing to all bountifulness, which causeth through us thanksgiving to God.* 2 Corinthians 9:11 We often forget to thank our heavenly Father for all the wonderful things He has done through His Son. We must not become ungrateful; therefore, if we are limited in our thanksgiving we can easily slip into thoughtlessness. *For the administration of this service not only supplieth the want of the saints, but is abundant also by many thanksgivings unto God.* 2 Corinthians 9:11-12 We thank each other upon receiving gifts, much more should we remember to thank God for His might gifts.

12) *Lack of Patience*

And besides this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity. 2 Peter 1:5-7

Patience is truly a virtue and commendable before the Lord. In our deliverance during the presence of a tribulation period, a rough passage in our daily life, we are to have patience as God's resolution manifest. During this hardship, our patience as shown in our unrelenting and steadfast faith is accountable as virtue to God. Patience is a direct reflection of our maintaining faith in our moment of crisis and holding to His Word. *According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue.* 2 Peter 1:3 Living in a fallen world, an imperfect environment, is going to breed mishaps and offensive situations; however, in our faith we have hope, and with hope, we gain patience, and through patience we acquire virtue. All work towards the attaining of the supernatural power of the Holy Spirit by the authority given in Christ. *My brethren, count it all joy when ye fall into divers temptations; Knowing this, that the trying of your faith worketh patience. But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.* James 1:2-4

13) *Lack of Faith*

Therefore being justified by faith we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ: By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Romans 5:1-5

Without faith we are lost to anything of the Kingdom of Heaven. All treasures of blessings, gifts, and promises are void to our life when we do not have faith. Jesus said only a small amount of true faith will open the Kingdom doors to receive. However, along with faith, we stay in hope of the anticipation of the answers to our prayers. We wait for the unseen to become the seen, the supernatural power from heaven to be witnessed in the natural. *For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.* Romans 12:3 Faith is our stronghold to all answered prayers, the key to the Kingdom of Heaven.

14) *Lack of Love*

And we have known and believed in the love that God hath for us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him. 1 John 4:16

Love is a word that is spoken frequently but often without meaning. It easily becomes second nature to apply the word love in our signature statements, but do we truly mean it when we say it? Love begins with loving God and understanding the very nature of His love. From His agape love, we learn to love ourselves and accept ourselves worthy to be loved, so that we may be equipped to love another. Love surpasses all things, and makes all things complete as God teaches us in His perfect love for His children. *And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.* Mark 12:30-31 Love is the beginning and the end to all things of God; and likewise, is the beginning to our faith, our hope, our patience, our forgiveness, and so forth. It all begins with love. We must have a heart of love to conquer hatred, anger, disillusionment, disappointment, discouragement, and the list goes on.

15) *Double-minded*

A double minded man is unstable in all his ways. James 1:8

Having two sets of standards to suit the occasion is not worthy of any attention and does not make for accountability in our relationship with our heavenly Father, nor with those we are close to. It makes us unreliable and not trustworthy. *Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded.* James 4:8 Hold to one standard, one belief, one trusting nature in all matters, and be sure that it is in the Lord.

16) *Ignorance*

For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God.

Romans 10:3

As a child of the Father, ignorance of His Word will never be an acceptable excuse. Becoming born-again to the spiritual being we are in Christ, we then begin our journey into learning how to live our new spirit life as we remain in the natural. We cannot claim "I didn't know" and have expectations of God. Maybe our children can use that excuse with us from time to time when they haven't been obedient, but it doesn't work that way with us as children of God. *But if any man be ignorant, let him be ignorant.* 1 Corinthians 14:38 If your choice is to not know God's Word, then remain without knowledge, but don't expect answered prayers.

17) Judgmental

Judge not, that ye be not judged. For with what judgment ye judge, ye shall be judged and with what measure ye mete, it shall be measured to you again. Matthew 7:2

God is very explicit in His Word. If we choose to judge others based on our opinion, then what we hold them in unfavorableness will be placed on us, and God will measure equal judgement onto us. We all have opinions, and it is easy to find fault with another simply by reason of not agreeing, but it is a dangerous mindset to speak accusations of disapproval in a means of judging. *Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be forgiven. Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again. Luke 6:37-38* Therefore, *Let a man so account of us, as of the ministers of Christ, and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful. But with me it is a very small thing that I should be judged of you, or of man's judgment: yea, I judge not mine own self. For I know nothing by myself; yet am I not hereby justified: but he that judge me is the Lord. 1 Corinthians 4:1-4* God is the only One who passes judgment. Because of our carnal tendencies, we often slip in this arena; however, when we find ourselves voicing our opinion in judgment of another, we should take notice and withdraw our statement of judgment. *For what have I to do to judge them also that are without? Do not ye judge them that are within? But them that are without God judgeth. Therefore put away from among yourselves that wicked person. 1 Corinthians 5:12-13* God calls us wicked who judges another. In John 8:15-16, *Ye judge after the flesh, I judge no man. And yet if I judge, my judgment is true: for I am not alone, but I and the Father that sent me.* There is only One who may pass judgment. There is a difference between disapproval and placing judgment on another person.

18) *Unbelief*

And he did not many mighty works there because of their unbelief. Matthew 13:58

There I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them. Mark 11:24

Without belief, the aforementioned doesn't apply. It all begins with believing in the Lord and relying on His Word, being faithful and obedient, trusting in hope for the manifestation, and knowing it WILL be forthcoming. We may think ourselves believers, but doubt can be just as prevalent as our belief, and it can wash away our belief in an instant. *Jesus said unto him, if thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth. And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief.* Mark 9:23-24 When we doubt to seeing the supernatural power of God exemplified in the natural, we have voided our prayer of faith. This is the major reason many do not receive from God. Though they believe their faith to be strong, there can be doubt, unbelief.

Just as we learn in the Bible of the miracles and healing by God as reflected in the Old Testament and by Jesus in the New Testament, they are still prevalent today in our lifetime. However, as God and His Son performed the miracles and healing in past generations, we are responsible through faith and belief to acquire them in our generation. Know how to receive the supernatural power in the Kingdom to heal yourself and others. Christ has given to each faithful believer His authority within the Kingdom of Heaven, and through the Holy Spirit, to receive that which we ask. Do not allow unbelief to block God's supernatural power from flowing continuously in your life.

Claim the Victory

God has proclaimed our healing and Christ has provided it. We need to take what has been given through mercy, grace, and faith as children of the Almighty King.

1) **Who** - is the healing for (you or a loved one)?

2) **What** - is the dis-ease (name the illness)?

3) **When** - did the dis-ease occur (timeframe it has been in your body)?

4) **Where** - in the body (organ affected)?

5) **Why** - you have it (how did it occur)?

Steps to Wellness

That your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God.

1 Corinthians 2:5

The supernatural power of healing is for every child of the Father and has been established at the foundation of His creation through the Living Word. In Christ, we may claim our healing through His blood, and by the Holy Spirit receive supernatural healing.

- Prepare** - believe you are healed
- Accept** - your healing has two components (stages); spirit and natural
- Remove** - yourself from bondage
- Pray** - concentrate on healing scriptures
- Hold** - in faith
- Patience** - for manifestation
- Claim** - the healing

Realign your relationship with God

- 1) Pray for forgiveness of sins, repent
- 2) Pray for release from bondage, curses, things that hold you in captivity
- 3) Remove strife
- 4) Remove idolatry
- 5) Remove unbelief
- 6) Pray for your healing with authority
- 7) Meditate on healing scriptures daily
- 8) Accept that you are healed, know the truth in Christ
- 9) Accept that God made your body to renew, replenish, and repair itself, continually
- 10) Know your healing is in the spirit realm and will manifest in the natural
- 11) Have patience and unwavering faith as your healing appears in the physical
- 12) Know that the physical body has to undergo the transformation of a healing process

Section IV



Era of Miracles

Definition of Miracles

God also bearing them witness, both with signs and wonders, and with divers miracles, and gifts of the Holy Ghost, according to his own will? Hebrews 2:4

He therefore that ministereth to you the Spirit, and worketh miracles among you, doeth he it by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith? Galatians 3:5

In some translations of the Bible the word "miracle" is used; and yet, the terms "wonder", "mighty work" or "sign" is also referenced for the same purpose to draw awareness to God's presence and power being manifested in the situation.

A miracle is an event in the external world brought about by God operating without the use of means capable of being discerned by the senses and designed to authenticate His divinity. It is an occurrence that cannot be defined by nature nor man to show the intervention of a power that is not limited by the laws either of matter or the mind; a power interrupting the fixed laws which govern their movements, a supernatural power.

A miracle is an instantaneous act of God. It is immediately witnessed; therefore, there is a difference in receiving a healing versus a miracle. A healing takes time for the natural body (flesh) to transform itself (renew, replenish, repair) into a state of wellness. We know that our healing is in the spirit realm first and patiently await to see the physical manifestation. Because of this, it becomes a process for the physical body to undergo the changes required. Our faith (along with hope and patience) holds unwaveringly as the physical reflects our healing.

However, a miracle happens in a nanosecond as though God has placed His hand on you. This is different to the Holy Spirit providing the power for a healing. It is easy to confuse the two, a miracle or a healing, because we expect when we pray to see immediate results of our healing, not considering the time lapse from the spiritual in the natural realm. It is important to understand the difference, so that what we pray we can receive because our understanding is aligned with the Father's replanned Kingdom principle for a healing or miracle.
